

# U.S. Congressional Investigations:

Internal analysis suggests that Russian Intelligence Agencies are playing the 'long game' when it comes to relations with the U.S. This has been evident by Russian President Vladimir Putin's actions in recent months. It is evident that he seeks to permanently connect the United States and Russia through the highest-level of relations ever achieved – with the next President of the United States. This could not occur without the praise and promise of President-elect Trump.
